Swiss-moto February 15-18, 2007: The two-wheel-exposition in Oerlikon was very successful. For my 20-year jubilee I ordered a tent with my emblem on the roof and brought some big photos to show what I am doing in my motorcycle school. Because it is so close to my shop, this event was very important as a start of the new motorcycle season. Next year, the Swiss-moto will be held Thursday February 21st to Sunday February 24th. Not so well known was the spot we had the Apéro; it was the bridge named by the famous Russian General Suworow. On that bridge the Russians fought against the French soldiers, and hundreds of the French fell into the canyon. The river underneath was red coloured from the blood entering into the lake. That was the 1st of October, 1799. The next station was a party boat in Flüelen. For more than two and a half hours we toured around in the Urnersee, seeing all the nice places in that area and everybody was invited to eat and drink for free.
